This Sunday, we "Share the Plate" with Florida Rights Restoration Coalition (FRRC), an organization committed to ending the disenfranchisement of and discrimination against people with convictions. For those with past convictions in Florida, FRRC is working to remove barriers to employment, housing, and opportunities.

For those who want to register to vote, but still owe fines and fees as part of their sentence, FRRC is working to remove those financial barriers. At this service all non-designated donations will be given to the Florida Rights Restoration Coalition.

Florida Rights Restoration Coalition — Sunday, February 18, 11:00 am

Social Justice is proud to host a representative from the Florida Rights Restoration Coalition, the recipient of our Share the Plate this Sunday. The organizing director of FRRC, Marquis McKenzie, will speak at our Sunday service and table during coffee hour.

FRRC is a grassroots, membership organization run by Returning Citizens, Formerly Incarcerated Persons (FIPs) in partnership with allies. We are dedicated to ending the disenfranchisement and discrimination against people with convictions and creating a more comprehensive and humane reentry system that will enhance successful reentry, reduce recidivism, and increase public safety.

UUFG gathered petitions to get the initial amendment on the ballot and has supported work to overcome road-blocks put in place by the Florida Legislature.
