By request of the Worship Team and the speaker, this Sunday's service will NOT be live-streamed. We hope you can join us in person for member Jean Cook's important message.


OUR WHOLE LIVES (OWL) TRAINING AT UUFG

"Our Whole Lives" – knows as OWL – is a lifespan sexuality education curricula developed by the Unitarian Universalist Association. Per the UUA's website, "It dismantles stereotypes and assumptions, builds self-acceptance and self-esteem, fosters healthy relationships, improves decision making, and has the potential to save lives." The curricula includes workshops and activities for K-1 children through Older Adults.

Mean Spirit — a Novel

As our first Common Read of the year, our Social Justice Circle will read an Osage author's novel about the Osage Nations tragedy described in the movie Killers of the Flower Moon. The title is Mean Spirit by native American writer Linda Hogan, who was a finalist for the Pulitzer Prize. Everyone is welcome to participate!

Here is a description:

Early in this century, rivers of oil were found beneath Oklahoma land belonging to Indian people, and beautiful Grace Banket became the richest person in the Territory. But she was murdered by the greed of white men, and the Graycloud family, who cared for her daughter, began dying mysteriously. Letters sent to Washington, D.C. begging for help went unanswered, until at last a Native American government official, Stace Red Hawk, traveled west to investigate. What he found has been documented by history: rampant fraud, intimidation, and murder. But he also found something truly extraordinary—his deepest self and abiding love for his people, and their brave past.


