UUFG'S SOCIAL JUSTICE COUNCIL ENDORSES CEASEFIRE RESOLUTION

This week the Social Justice Council of UUFG sent an endorsement of the Resolution for Ceasefire in Gaza that Jewish Voices for Peace is bringing before the Gainesville City and Alachua County Commissions.

Our letter of endorsement and the resolution calls for: "an immediate and permanent ceasefire in Palestine; the restoration of water, fuel, electricity, and other basic services; and the passage of adequate humanitarian aid to Gaza."

The Social Justice Council is joining with other faith-based organizations, community organizations, unions, and businesses to endorse this action.

If you are not a member of Social Justice but would like to support this cause, please try to attend the next City and County Commission meetings or send emails or letters to those bodies encouraging them to support a resolution for Ceasefire. Look for a News and Needs post announcing meeting times.

Common Read Starting in January Mean Spirit — a Novel

Social Justice will read an Osage author's novel about the Osage Nations tragedy described in the movie *Killers of the Flower Moon*. The title is *Mean Spirit* by native American writer Linda Hogan, who was a finalist for the Pulitzer Prize.

Here is a description:

Early in this century, rivers of oil were found beneath Oklahoma land belonging to Indian people, and beautiful Grace Banket became the richest person in the Territory. But she was murdered by the greed of white men, and the Graycloud family, who cared for her daughter, began dying mysteriously. Letters sent to Washington, D.C. begging for help went unanswered, until at last a Native American government official, Stace Red Hawk, traveled west to investigate. What he found has been documented by history: rampant fraud, intimidation, and murder. But he also found something truly extraordinary—his deepest self and abiding love for his people, and their brave past.


Monday, January 22, 7:00 pm — Popcorn & a Movie
