UUFG'S PLEDGE DRIVE CONTINUES!

Dear Members and Friends of UUFG,

We are all in the same boat and depend on each other for a successful future at UUFG. However, to sail the UUFG Boat home and call a full-time minister, we



must all pitch in and cast more sails into the wind. All of us must be on board- calling on our talents and resources — to steer our Boat to a safe port.

Our goal this year is to hire a full-time interim minister. Many factors are working against us: a small pool of qualified ministers, social/political barriers to moving to Florida, and rising operational costs. These challenges have been a perfect storm battering the UUFG Boat. Like the forces of the storm, these conditions are out of our immediate control. We have the ability and spirit to overcome these forces.

Although the costs of hiring a full-time minister have increased (from \$96,000 to \$129,500 in two years!), our Fellowship remains committed to paying an ethical salary to each of our employees. To make it to port we need at least a 20% increase in our total pledges.

Last year, we counted 107 pledges that generated about \$270,000 in giving. This year we will have to raise our pledges to at least \$324,000 — an increase of \$54,000 from all giving units. All are invited to attend our April 14 Social Justice Circle Meeting. Normally, we meet on third Sundays, but this month we're meeting on the second Sunday, so we can attend the Read-Out!) Come get training for gathering petitions for Medicaid Expansion. Medicaid Expansion in Florida would allow anyone whose income qualifies to join Medicaid. Right now in Florida, only pregnant women and their children and people with disabilities are eligible for Medicaid.

This amendment would allow about 800,000+ low-income Floridians to get health care under Medicaid. It will also benefit rural hospitals who are dependent on Medicaid funds and it now has bipartisan support in the legislature. 
