The Memory Garden is populated with 44 beautiful colorful camellias. Unfortunately, the shrubs are overgrown and covered with prickly vines and Virginia creeper. Weeds are growing up from the ground and vines are descending from the trees. The area needs pruning and cleanup that requires professional equipment, expertise and labor. The grant will cover the cost of contracting with a licensed, insured maintenance crew to clean and prune the area.

FROM THE UUFG CARE TEAM

Did You Know there is a number to call when you are depressed?

It's easy to feel anxious, depressed or worried. There are so many challenges affecting us today that it is easy to feel overwhelmed and not sure where to turn for help and support. We don't want to overburden our friends and close family members. Maybe its evening or the weekend and our doctor's or therapist's office is closed. What can we do?

One answer is the Florida Warm Line: (800) 945-1355. It is open from 4 pm to 10 pm 365 days a year. Here, you can talk to someone about any mental health issue or concern that is bothering you. It may be anxiety, depression or something else. It is not intended for emergencies or possible suicide. Rather, this is a place to turn to when most doctors and therapists are closed and you just feel you need to talk to someone, without burdening friends or family. Here is more information from the Warm Line website:

The Florida Warm Line is a FREE resource open 365 days a year from 4 to 10 pm: perfectly timed to be available after traditional mental health resources are closed for the day. This phone line was launched in 2016 and is run by the Florida Department of Children and Families through a partnership with the Peer Support Coalition of Florida.

The goal of this phone line is to empower and uplift people to take their mental health into their own hands. And also, to support them in that journey with people who truly understand what they are going through. Operators help you identify the root issue needing attention, and will ensure you have all the care you need because everything you experience matters. The Florida Warm Line number is 1-800-945-1355.

This phone line is for adults 18+ who are dealing with mental health issues. Family members that need support for a loved one can benefit from using the Florida Warm Line. One example includes tips on how to be the best supporter for your loved one in need.

If you are ever feeling lonely, without support, and need someone to talk to, (even if it's just about your day or a funny joke you need to share) don't hesitate to call.

At General Assembly 2024, delegates will vote on whether an amended version of Article II should be adopted as the new Article II of the UUA bylaws. The final version of Article II was presented to the UUA board in October 2023 after a number of amendments by the 2023 General Assembly. Our Fellowship is sending four delegates to GA 2024. This ballot item provides our delegates with a sense of our congregation's collective stand on this issue while recognizing that the version of Article II that is ultimately put to a vote may not be exactly what we're reading today.
