UUFG FOUNDATION GRANTS IN ACTION!

Phillips Hall Light Fixtures

One of the grants awarded was submitted by Marilyn Roberts and went toward upgrading the Social Hall Light Fixtures.

The old ceiling lights were outdated and some were not functioning at all. The project, already completed, replaced 12 existing recessed cans with new LED type cans and flat wafer type lights that are much more energy-efficient. Another move toward a greener campus. Sound System Upgrades

The UUFG Foundation provided funds for four grants this spring cycle. One of those grants is for a sound system upgrade for the Sanctuary, submitted by Liz Stewart and Debra Neill-Mareci

It has become evident that the sound system has been unreliable and occasionally subject to "drop out" causing interruptions of the service. The grant has gone toward the purchase of two Shure cabled microphones, two Atlas IED mic stands and two Atlas boom extenders. This equipment was installed this past week, complementing and augmenting our other equipment.

Jim Benedict has worked diligently to bring the system up to date and was instrumental in recommending and installing the new equipment. Our improved sound system enhances the experience for those in attendance, people using the hearing assist systems, and Zoom participants.

Thank you Jim, Debra, and Liz for this much needed upgrade.
